Located on the coast of Western Australia and surrounded by beautiful beaches, Perth is a multicultural city offering world-class education, a Mediterranean climate, a clean and safe environment, and friendly residents.

## 01 Diversity and Culture

Perth is one of the most multicultural cities in Australia, with people from over 200 different nationalities calling it home.

Around 32% of Perth's population was born overseas, and more than 240 languages and dialects are spoken, including Aboriginal languages.

Warm and welcoming, Perth offers diverse communities, a laid-back outdoor lifestyle, and a strong love of sport and nature.

## 02 Shopping

Perth's shopping scene has something for everyone with a diverse range of shopping centres offering unique experiences.

## 03 Transport

There are two main types of public transport in Perth: the bus and train. All buses within the Perth, Fremantle and Joondalup city zones are free for everyone. All full-time students are eligible for concession rates, which can be up to 40% discount on all rides.

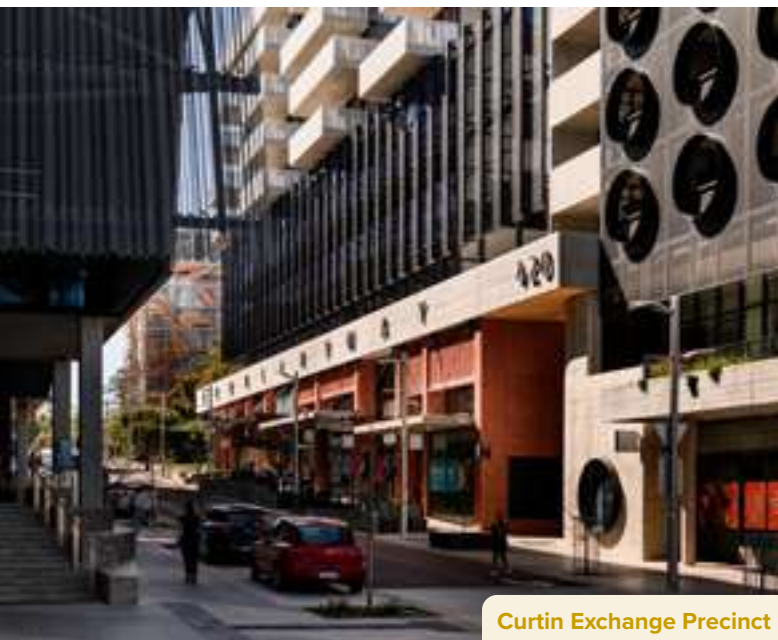

# Accommodation options

# Care of students under the age of 18

If you are under 18 years of age, you are classified as a minor and must meet immigration requirements for accommodation, support and general welfare arrangements before a student visa is granted.

You will need to ensure that appropriate care and living arrangements are in place before you arrive in Australia. Accommodation and welfare arrangements may be organised by parents or guardians, however, the College must approve these arrangements before final documentation can be issued. Please refer to the flowchart below for more information.

## 3. Submit supporting documents

Provide all required documents relevant to your chosen arrangement.

## 4. Welfare Arrangement Assessment

Curtin College reviews the submitted accommodation and welfare arrangements.

## 5. Approval and Student Visa Preparation

Once approved, proceed with your student visa application.

### Under 18 Support

The Curtin College Student Counsellor will be responsible for screening and monitoring the homestay provider in accordance with its relevant policies and procedures and will take place prior to you residing in the accommodation and again at least every six months thereafter while you are Under 18 and remain in the accommodation.



### Important information

A Confirmation of Appropriate Accommodation and Welfare (CAAW) letter is only issued for Option A (Approved Homestay + ISA Welfare Service). For Option B and Option C, welfare arrangements are assessed and approved directly by the Department of Home Affairs, and a CAAW letter is not required.

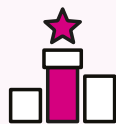
